## **No Such thing as a Long Trip (anymore)**

**Wild Duck and the Mad Poet**

The story goes that Poet called the Wild Duck and asked, "How would you like to go for a ride and attend the memorial for a WW II hero?" Without even asking, the Duck said sounds good and is this the five minute notice? Poet knew that Wild Duck was known to have said "There is no such thing as a long trip anymore, especially after the U.S.A. Four Corners tour." The only thing the Duck would like was a "five minute notice" and that was not really necessary either.

A couple of years earlier, Wild Duck had the honor of visiting with LTCOL Villa celebrating his 93<sup>rd</sup> birthday and had shared some of his war stories of escaping the Bataan Death March and forming guerrilla groups to fight the Japanese during their occupation of the Philippines. Wild Duck asked the Poet, "Will you give me five minutes to throw some clothes together?" Poet suggested we slow down a bit and ride down to Vancouver WA. and get a three hour head start on the 1100 mile trip to Oxnard. Also, we agreed to keep silent and surprise Daisy Villa Mischke (Wild Flower), the daughter of LTCOL Villa and a strong supporter of CVI.

The wives were sure quick to support the Daring Duo in their next escapade. With bikes tweaked, and a couple changes of clothes, The Duo left Poets house on Wednesday to get a three hour head start by overnighing in Vancouver Wa. Waking up to a light drizzle, they navigated the rush hour traffic of Portland and headed south.



Cruising the Siskiyou Mountains, Grant's Pass, Crater Lake and screaming down the I-5 hills into Yreka, Weed and increasing temperatures, the Duo shed some winter riding gear as they neared Sacramento. On Friday The Duo discovered the "Source of Global Warming" in an area from Stockton to Coalinga. The two desperately tried holding their breath as there were no windows to close or A/C to turn off. There were not less than 24,817 head of cattle being fed flatulents and every stinking one of them had "the farts". This was truly the source of "Global Warming". Not bad for a couple of old retirees. Leaving Los Angeles County, the Grape Vine provided white hill tops and a lot of sleet, snow, and rain. The below freezing temperature in Northern California provided a reminder that it is still April and Global Warming is not completely here yet.

### Blue Star Memorial Bi-way Marker Dedication

## Legislative News

JD provided this information recently concerning a new law that the governor recently signed into legislation.

The Governor today signed into law SB 5134 which empowers police officers to impound a motorcycle if a driver is pulled over for a traffic stop and does NOT have a motorcycle endorsement on their license.

So if ever you needed an incentive to get your endorsement, this is it -- once the bill goes into effect, which will be 90 days after the session ends (so sometime in mid August), you will likely lose your bike to impound if you are pulled over and you don't have any endorsement on your license.
